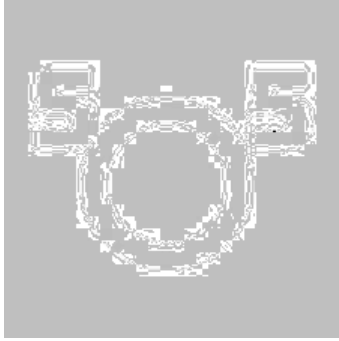

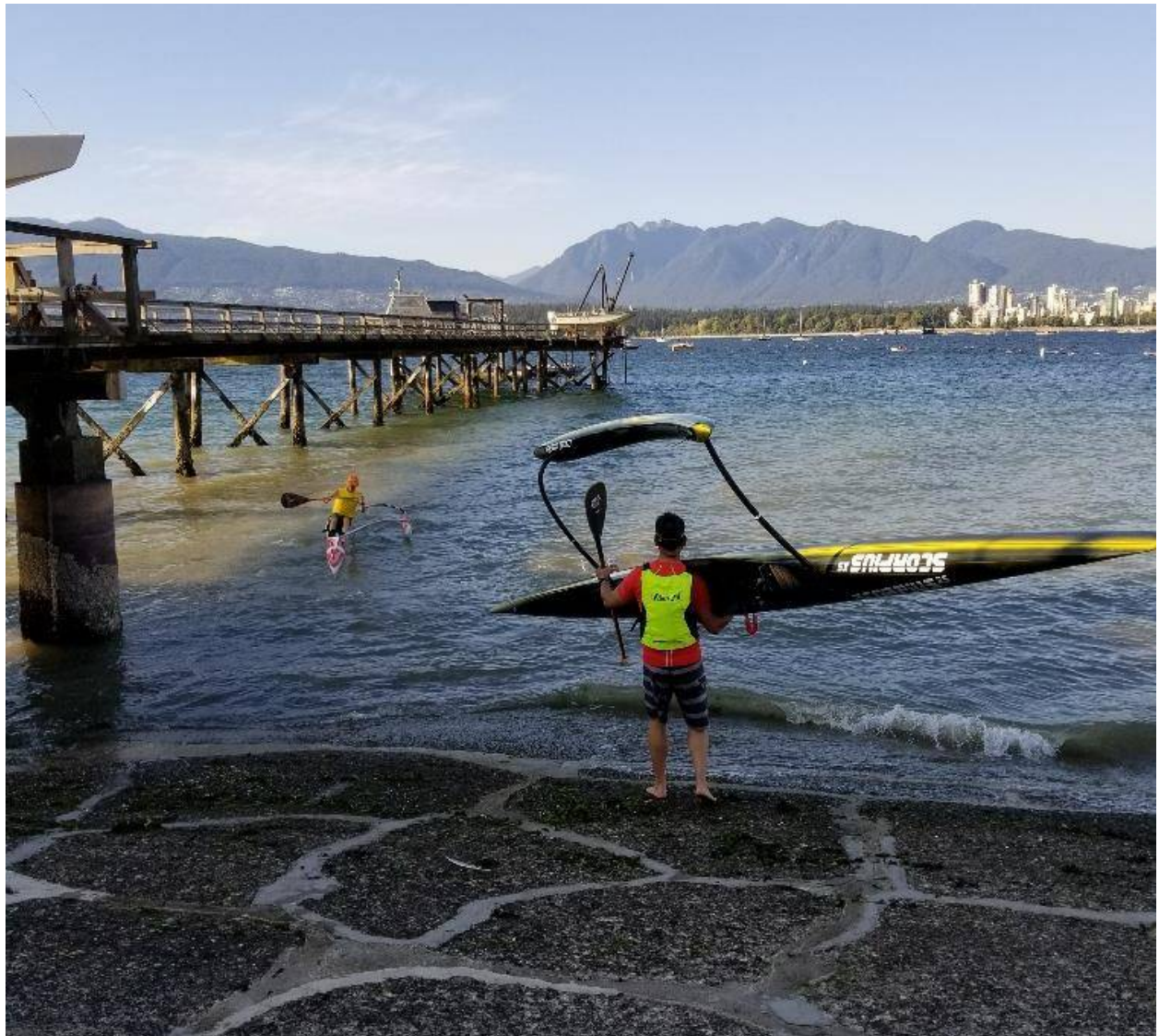

Wireless Person Overboard System \$80

After teaming with Fugawi, Sea-Tags MOB alarm system is now available in North America. There are two components to the Sea-Tags MOB system. First is a free app, which can be downloaded to all smartphones onboard. Second, is the waterproof wristbands worn by captain and crew. The wristband emits four signals per second and as long as the wristband is within 100 metres from the boat it won't trigger an alarm. As soon as the wristband is submerged under water, communication is lost and an alarm is sounded. The time and location of the emergency are saved and the smart phones can be programmed to send a notification to an emergency contact on shore.
